**Kimball Senior Center Report**

- The Kimball Senior Center attendance for the month of June 2018 was 2,020.
- The San Diego Food Bank monthly senior commodity distribution program helped 250 senior citizens.
- Attendance on Fridays during the month of June 2018 was 141.

**Tiny Tots Report**

- The Tiny Tots held their annual end of the year picnic on Monday, June 11, with both classes coming together for sack races, spoon races and a parachute game.
- The Tiny Tots class of 2018 graduated on Thursday, June 14, where they showcased all they have learned. The theme for the graduation was Hawaiian surf party.

**Camacho Center**

- Camacho Recreation Center is currently offering summer activities to the youth in the community, starting June 7 to July 22. Camacho staff will be offering relay races, flag football, tennis, whiffle ball, outdoor water activities just to name a few. This is a free program and is available to anyone interested in participating. These activities are available Monday to Saturday 3:00pm to 5:30pm. All materials will be provided.
- Camacho Recreation Center had 1,650 participants for the month of May.
- Current classes at Camacho are as follows; Youth Hip Hop Classes, Arts and Craft Music classes, Youth Soccer Training, and Martial Arts.
- Camacho will begin offering open gym for volleyball every Saturday and Sunday from 11:00 am to 12:30 pm.

**Las Palmas Pool Report**

- During June recreational swim was held almost every day of the week and there were 2,150 participants.
- Approximately, 300 participants took swim lessons during the month of June and all classes were full.
- Pool staff hosted practice for South Bay Aquatics Swim Club, as well as, Southern Water Polo and South Coast Water Polo.

**Special Events**

- Movie in the Park – The Community Service Department hosted their first Summer Movies in the Park on Friday, June 8, at Las Palmas Park. Despicable Me 3 began at 8:00pm and was attended by a few hundred people. Staff also hosted some recreational activities prior to the movie, such as whiffle ball and arts and crafts.
- The Miss National City Educational Pageant took place on June 30, at the Fourth of July Carnival. Our winners were Destiny Muñoz, Anais Rivera and Michelle Rodriguez.

**Casa de Salud Youth Center & Volunteer Management**

- Casa de Salud has partnered with Feeding San Diego to provide hot lunches, snack, and weekly produce bags for the youth throughout the month of June and July.
- Casa de Salud will be hosting a field trip to Balboa Park in July.

### **Parks Division Report**

- During the month of June the Parks department trimmed 145 trees and removed 10 trees.
