## **Recap of Housing Assistance Provided by the City of National City**

- 48-hour Emergency Hotel Assistance was provided on 1/22/24 to 48 households at the Ramada Inn.
- Tenant Relocation Assistance (1/31/24) §§ 17975.2 included 2 months rent and utilities to 26 households.
- Total funding from the City: \$160,547.

### **Hotel Placement Assistance has been provided by SBCS (private funding)**

SBCS has provided National City residents with 10-14 Day Hotel Placements

- 50 Households from National City
- 60 Hotel Rooms
- 178 Family Members

## County of San Diego Emergency Temporary Lodging Program

- On January 30, 2024, the San Diego County Board of Supervisors adopted a \$10 million flood relief plan that included an Emergency Temporary Lodging Program. The program officially started on February 12, 2024 for individuals and families who were displaced from their homes due to the flooding that began on January 22, 2024.
- The program will provide 30 days of emergency lodging to people displaced by the January 22, 2024 storm.
- The County is working directly with various community agencies including:
  - San Diego County Office of Education
  - San Diego Housing Commission
  - Southeast Disaster Response Team (YMCA and partner agencies)
  - South Bay Community Services.
- Households who did not submit the County's initial online assessment survey, assisted directly by a community agency listed above, or visited a Local Assistance Center can **call 2-1-1**. New applications will be accepted through February 23, 2024.

# Assistance Programs

On February 19, 2024, President Joe Biden approved California's request for a major disaster declaration, ordering that federal aid go toward helping San Diego County residents recover after last month's historic storm.

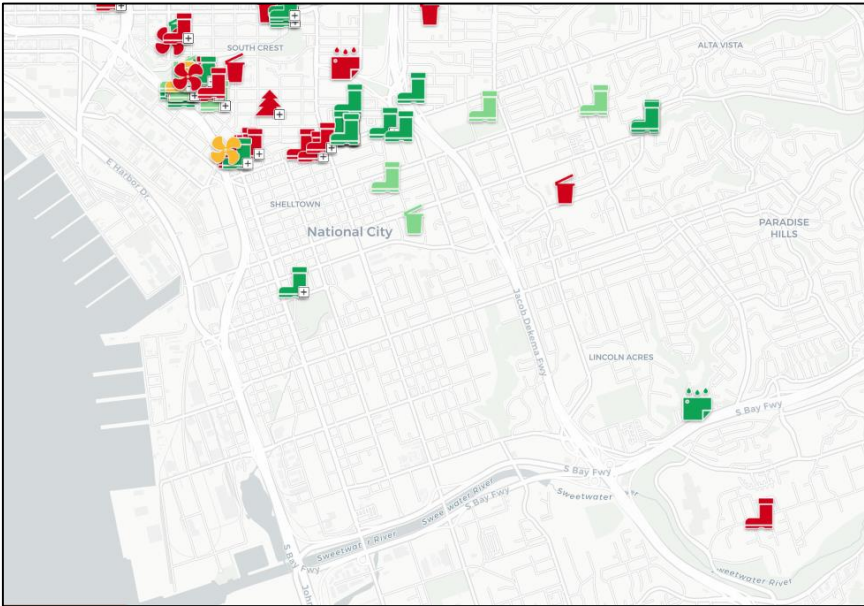
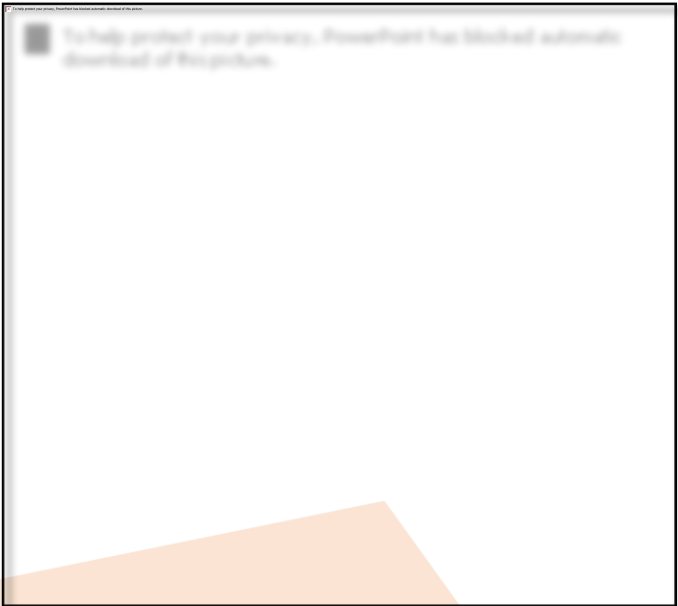

# Team Rubicon Assistance



Provided Assistance since January 27, 2024

- Muck out, debris removal, removed drywall/insulation/flooring
- Approximately 8,982 cubic feet of debris
- Spent 192.5 hours on-site at 22 locations
- 770 volunteer hours
