My name is Wendy Egan, and I'm a local community member and nonprofit founder here in National City.

I'm speaking today on behalf of a local business working to invest in our community at a commercial space on 8th Street. Aunautic, has been actively trying to move this project forward, but they've encountered significant challenges navigating the city's permitting and plan access process.

From what we understand, there have been delays and barriers in accessing existing building drawings information that is critical for architects and engineers to safely and accurately develop plans for mechanical, plumbing, and electrical systems. Without access to this information, projects stall, costs increase, and small businesses are left in limbo.

This isn't just about one project—this affects economic growth, local investment, and the ability for businesses to open their doors .

We respectfully ask for:

- Clear guidance on how applicants can access existing building records
- Improved communication between departments and applicants
- A streamlined, transparent process that supports—not delays—responsible development
